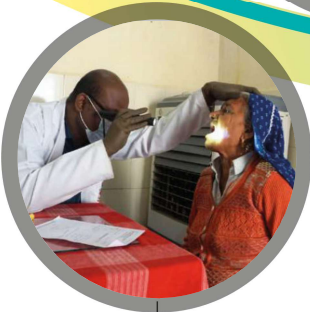

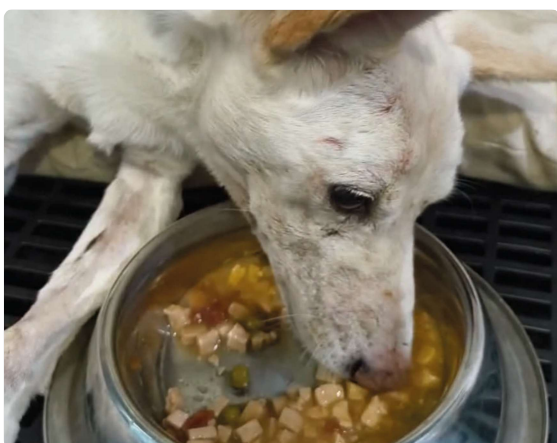

Guddu's Road to Healing: A Testament to Compassionate Care



A 5-year-old stray dog, affectionately named Guddu by rescuers, was rushed to CGS Hospital following a severe road traffic accident. Found motionless by the roadside, bleeding from the mouth, and in deep shock, the dog was in a critical condition. With visible injuries and organs protruding from the flank region, it was a case of evisceration.

Guddu's chances of survival looked bleak. He was unresponsive and cold to the touch, and barely breathing. The dedicated veterinary team immediately took the necessary steps to stabilise him. Intravenous fluids, oxygen therapy, and shock medications were

administered as the veterinary team worked tirelessly to save his life.

A thorough examination revealed that a large portion of Guddu's intestines had herniated and eviscerated through a tear in his abdominal wall. His only chance at survival was emergency surgery. Without hesitation, an exploratory laparotomy was performed. The exposed intestines were cleaned and gently repositioned. The torn abdominal wall was repaired, and the wound was closed with utmost care.

Post-surgery, Guddu stayed in intensive care and received round-the-clock treatment and care. Pain management, antibiotics, fluids, and proper nutrition were all part of the recovery protocol. Gradually, Guddu began to show signs of improvement. Guddu's recovery was nothing short of a miracle. His will to live, combined with timely veterinary care, saved his life.
