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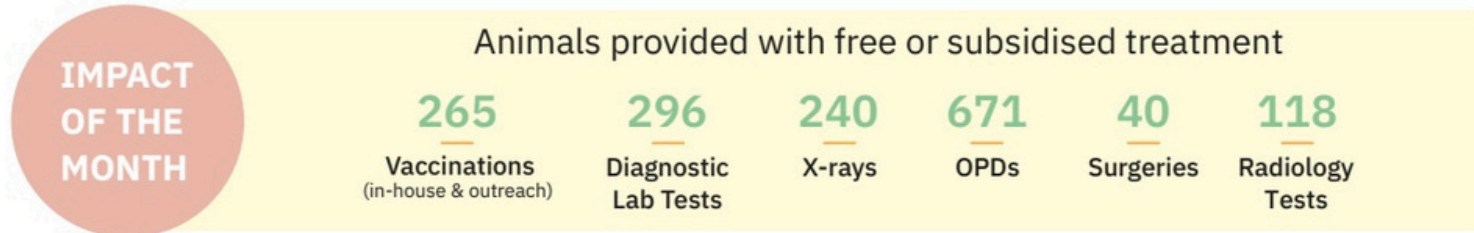




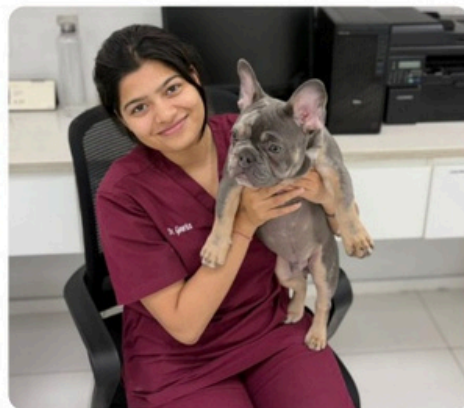

Physiotherapy Awareness Month



Observing Physiotherapy Awareness Month, CGS Hospital provided advanced rehabilitation for community dogs and cats recovering from

serious accident-related injuries. Through the PASHA wing, specialised care was provided to vulnerable animals, supporting their mobility, comfort, and confidence. The rehabilitation care provided at CGS included therapies such as underwater treadmill, hydrotherapy, VHBOT, TENS, and laser therapy, each chosen to promote pain relief, healing, muscle strengthening, and functional recovery. These treatments improved outcomes for ailing dogs and cats with fractures, soft tissue injuries, neurological weakness, and post-surgical challenges.

Advancing Veterinary Excellence through Specialised Surgical Training



Dr Nitin Kandpal, Senior Veterinarian at CGS Hospital, recently participated in a specialised surgery workshop organised by the National Veterinary Foundation at Assam Veterinary College, Guwahati.
